



Rubicon Estate

In 1880, Finnish sea captain Gustave Niebaum acquired the Inglenook Estate and began building the stone Chateau for his winery. His wines became world renowned and contributed to the growing fame of the Napa Valley. In 1964 the property was divided and soon winemaking at the Chateau ceased. Francis and Eleanor Coppola purchased most of the properties in 1975, then reunited the estate with the acquisition of the Chateau and the remaining vineyards in 1995



Reverend Estate

In 1887, Rev. Dr. Charles H. Johnson, of the Methodist Church, and his wife, Mrs. Johnson, donated the land on which this walkway was built. It was the property of the Rev. Dr. Johnson, and was donated to the City of Chicago in 1887. The walkway was built in 1888, and is one of the most beautiful in the city.













BERINGER BROTHERS WINERY

BUILT BY FREDERICK AND JACOB BERINGER, NATIVES OF MAINZ, GERMANY, THIS WINERY HAS THE UNIQUE DISTINCTION OF NEVER HAVING CEASED OPERATIONS SINCE ITS FOUNDING IN 1876. HERE, IN THE EUROPEAN TRADITION, WERE DUG UNDERGROUND WINE TUNNELS HUNDREDS OF FEET IN LENGTH. THESE MAINTAIN A CONSTANT TEMPERATURE OF 58 DEGREES, A FACTOR CONSIDERED NECESSARY IN THE MATURING AND AGING OF FINE WINES.
